#### News and Updates from the Club Management

#### Course Matters

There have been a number of projects on the go in January, with the greens staff switching from one job to another based around whether the ground was frozen:

This month the trees to the right and left of the 3<sup>rd</sup>, left of the 6<sup>th</sup> and left of the 5<sup>th</sup> have been thinned and maintained. There have also been two large willows on the 12<sup>th</sup> that came down in heavy winds and these have been chopped up into manageable pieces. Some tree stumps have also been removed.

The  $17^{th}$  tee has been levelled, has its root zone and top dressing and is ready for turf. Turf will also be added to the drainage around the  $6^{th}$  green and the drainage areas dug out on the  $10^{th}$  and  $17^{th}$ . We need the

ground to thaw next so that the turf nurseries can supply a good depth of sod. Following this we turn attention to the  $2^{nd}$  tee.

There are now sleeper edges to the  $15^{th}$  tee. In the spring we will apply granite dust to this tee and the new path to the  $5^{th}$  tee. The new ladies' tee signs are now out on the course.

A couple of parish notices on good practice to assist the greenkeepers:

Please don't try to get the ball out of the hole by using your putter as this damages the hole/cup. Worse, if the ground is frozen the green keepers cannot cut a fresh hole (up to 8 inches of thawed ground required for this) and the damage can affect following golfers for some time.

Please replace your divots immediately – once the ground freezes the divot will not root again in the divot hole. Thank you.

#### Clubhouse

The new lockers are now installed and look good. There were some teething problems with the locks, but that has been sorted out. Overall the locker room looks much smarter, so thanks go to Andy and Steve for making it all happen. Those who have paid for a new locker can pick up their key from the downstairs bar. There are only three small lockers left for hire, so send Steve Montague an email at sdmontague@btinternet.com if you would like one of these.

The Men's locker room was cleared of all abandoned clothing and shoes at the beginning of January so that we could paint and get ready for the new lockers. These items are in black bin bags in the upstairs storage area in the shop. Please recover any items by 15 February 17, as remaining items will be discarded after this date.

#### **Rules of Golf**

#### Playing from Wrong Teeing Ground (Rules 11-4, 11-5)

a. <u>Match Play</u>. If a player, when starting a hole, plays a ball from outside the teeing ground, or the wrong teeing ground, there is no penalty but the opponent may immediately require the player to cancel the stroke and play a ball from within the teeing ground.

b. <u>Stroke Play</u>. If a competitor, when starting a hole, plays a ball from outside the teeing ground, or the wrong teeing ground, he incurs a penalty of two strokes and must then play the ball from within the teeing ground.

#### Tip of the Month from your Club Professional, Terry Bunyan

Keep warm – seriously. This really is the time of year to get your game sorted and of course Russell and I are happy to assist. Also start thinking about what you want to achieve this coming season and how you can do it.

Spend time not only in the range, for you can do a lot at home. I practice a lot of 'shadow swings' indoors, working on the correct moves. You can also practice your putting on the carpet. And to finish, let me give you something to think about: there is no 'one way' to swing the golf club. I've always taught the person - not a method – because we are all different shapes and sizes and have limitations.

The quickest way to lower your scores? Drive it well off the tee and have a great short game!



#### Getting a Handicap/Getting to Know People

There are always new and not-so-new members (some older ones and some not-so-old), who play the course by themselves, but really would like to meet and play with other members,

Perhaps you need to get three cards marked for handicap reasons, or perhaps just to get to know other members. We realise that time constraints and availability can make this a problem, but we can help.

The simplest way to get to meet members is probably just to turn up on a Monday or Wednesday morning. The Seniors' Section (age 55+) has very informal fun competitions, interspersed with formal competitive ones, on Mondays and Wednesdays, starting at 8:30am, that are run as roll-ups so there is no need to book ahead – just turn up. You don't have to be a Senior to join in – all are welcome and anyone you play with will be happy to mark a handicap card for you. The Ladies' Section has a similar pattern for all ladies, but their start time is normally 10:00am on Mondays and Wednesdays. Many Seniors and Ladies also play together, informally, on a Friday, starting at about 8:30am – again, just turn up and play with them.

Another easy option is to use the Pro Shop. If you turn up and tell whoever is on duty that you would like to play a round with someone, they will do their best to introduce you to whoever is due to be going out (any Club member with an existing handicap can mark a handicap card for you).

Weekends can be busier and competitions are often a little more formal. We suggest that if you are only available at a weekend you should discuss a suitable day and time with the shop staff.

If you are having lessons with either Terry Bunyan or Russell Phillips, either of them will steer you towards a member who might be able to play with you until you get established.

Finally, you can yourself arrange to meet up and play with a member. In the lobby between the shop and the changing rooms is a folder caller 'Availability Book', in which members volunteer their contact details and probable availability to play with someone new.

Our Club is known for its friendliness, but beware – friendly 'banter' on and off the course is part of this, especially between the male golfers!

#### Play with a Stranger? The Availability Book

Members willing to play a round or two with a new member, or a new member still needing a handicap or a friendly round of golf, are asked to put their general availability and contact details in the Availability Book in the lobby between the shop and the changing rooms. If you are looking for someone to play with, do use the book.
