News and Updates from the Club Management

We wish all members a very happy Christmas and great golf in the new year! This seems an appropriate time to thank Lance for his 'Vale' compilations each month. The next issue will be 1 February 17 as Lance takes a well-earned Christmas break!

Course Matters

The drainage work around the 6th green is now complete. The new 5th tee is also finished and turfed.

Additional winter projects include re-surfacing the 17^{th} tee, re-surfacing and extending the 2^{nd} tee and putting out a new set of ladies tee markers. The greenkeepers are currently setting in the concrete bases for the ladies' markers to go in.

We are also verti-draining the fairways once again this winter. At the date of writing the 2nd, 6th and 10th have been verti-drained.

<u>Buggies</u>. Some of the buggies have been returned to the depot, but not all. This feature is being written several days in advance of 1 December but the forecast still looks dry, the course is currently dry and hence there is every chance that buggies will still be on the course into December.

<u>Members' Loyalty Cards (White Cards)</u>. Apologies for the fact that the white cards were only working in the bar and not the shop. This turned out to be a Windows problem that the system operator has now corrected and hence you can now use the cards in the shop again.

Rules of Golf

Definition - 'Casual Water'

From time to time play at AVGC and elsewhere is permitted even when snow and/or ice are present on the ground. Knowledge of the following definition regarding snow and ice may be helpful.

In the Rules of Golf, 'Casual Water' is defined as '...any temporary accumulation of water on the course that is not in a water hazard and invisible before or after the player takes his stance. Snow and natural ice, other than frost, are either casual water or loose impediments, at the option of the player...dew and frost are not casual water.'

Tip of the Month from your Head PGA Professional, Russell Phillips

As the cold wet weather is now upon us, the greens have softened and the ball is not travelling as far. Play your approach shots with care. This time of year an extra club will enable you to pitch the ball on the green and stop quickly; don't be short. If the ground hardens due to ice you may find a club less is required.

Play with a harder compound ball to maximise the distance, as soft balls have little use at this time of year. A hard compound ball will often be labelled 'Distance'.





Some people simply don't get on with the them up.




Far too Social

Some people walk across two fairways game - here are more of the things that hold simply to say hello. Save time and keep your conversation to the Clubhouse




Cover Up

Some people look as if they are playing in the Open Championship. Studying the line from every angle takes a lot of time when you take 42 putts to the round.




Holeing Out Some golfers insist on putting when the hole is well and truly lost. Save the putt for the next hole - when it might matter.
