News and Updates from the Club Management

Course

The month of June proved to be tumultuous for the greenkeeping staff when three team members moved on to pastures new - Andy Clark, Alex Groom and Will Bond. A huge thanks and best wishes to them all in their future endeavours. We are fortunate to have secured the services of Adam, Matt and Jack as their replacements and finally Luke has a big grin on his face, as they all seem to be settling in very well. We hope to take on one more greenkeeper within the next two weeks.

General News

We hosted the RAF Supply Championships in the third week of June, which were very successful. RAF personnel entered from Stations across the country, with the furthest being a team from Cyprus who flew in for the event! We would like to thank all members for their patience and tolerance during these two days. As a direct result the funds from this event are going someway to purchasing a new greens-mower and a rough-mower, which we should get delivery of within the next two weeks.

Following a meeting with our Club Captains, we have laid out plans by which we hope to attract a greater percentage of young members. An EGU survey had highlighted the problem within golf, where the average age of a Golf Club member is increasing rapidly. We have therefore reviewed our Club rules, which will result in the following revisions:

- Effective from 1 July 2017 the downstairs bar will become a stud/spike bar from 1 April - 31 October annually. However, should the weather be particularly inclement during this period, the bar will revert temporarily back to 'shoes only'. Should this be necessary there will be clearly displayed signs warning of the restriction. Similarly, should the weather between 1 November - 31 March be exceptionally dry, the bar will revert back to a stud/spike bar and the signs will reflect this. Regardless, we would ask that golfers always clean their shoes on the air blower/brush before using the Clubhouse. Please bear with us in terms of getting the proper signs made up.
- We will be buying a new coffee machine and are also investigating getting one for the Pro Shop too.
- Phones in the Clubhouse: we will continue with the ban of talking on a mobile phone in the Clubhouse (the reception is far better anyway if you step outside the back door). Using phones silently is no problem, for example sending texts, plotting percentage of fairways hit in regulation or checking the weather is fine.
- A ban on hats in the Clubhouse will be removed. Whilst we old codgers understand why it's there, the younger generation may not.
- Smart/casual dress regulations for the golf course remain unaltered.

In addition to these changes and in order to attract very young members, we have made a shortened 'blue' course around the front nine holes - you may have noticed the blue square markers on the fairways. If for example you are playing with a 7 year old, they should tee up either side of the blue marker and see if they can score a par - just like Rory or Beef! This allows us to offer a new category of membership and is very much supported by Russell Phillips.

Catering

Please note that, with immediate effect, catering will be extended from 4pm to 8pm on Thursday and Friday nights throughout July and August. Steph will also endeavour to offer a couple of specials on these evenings.

President's Day

The entry sheets for Presidents' Day will be going up shortly, so keep an eye out for them. As usual and in addition to the usual golf competitions, there will be a putting and a chipping competition, together with the 'burst the helium balloon' (hovering over the driving range) competition. In each case, 50% of the prize money will go to the Captains' charity.

Rules of Golf

Identifying Ball (Rule 12-2). Except in a hazard, if a player believes a ball to be his/hers, (s)he may lift the ball to identify it...but, before lifting the ball the player must announce his intention to his opponent (in match play) or marker or fellow-competitor in stroke play, and mark the position of the ball. The ball when lifted must not be cleaned beyond the extent necessary to identify it. Failure by the player to abide by these requirements, or lifting the ball in a hazard, **incurs a penalty of one stroke**.

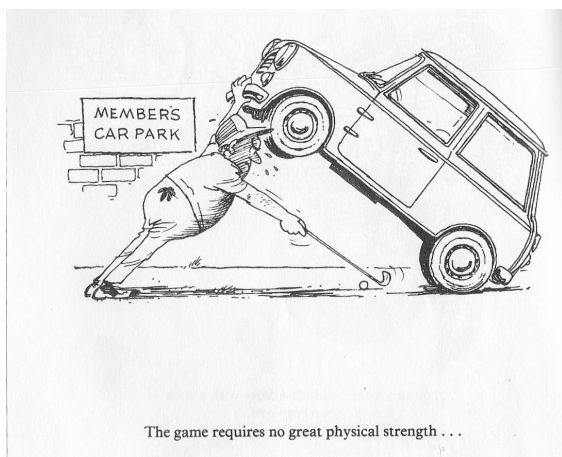
Local Rule – Drainage Ditches

The list of Local Rules in the changing room lobby includes one on Ground Under Repair. As a reminder, this states that relief may be taken under Rule 25-1b from:

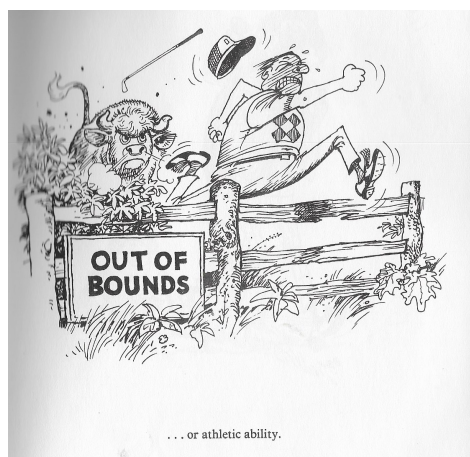
- heavy tyre marks caused by motor vehicles on the course;
- sand, stone or earth filled drainage ditches. Drainage ditches are in long straight lines and relief may be taken **even if they are now grassed over**;
- holes created by the removal of trees.

In late November 2013 John Kitchen learned that Lance Redler produced a monthly newsletter for his former Club, so asked to be told what was involved in producing it. He was given outline details and nothing more was heard until January 2014, when John told Lance that his offer (what offer!!!) to produce a Club newsletter had been gratefully accepted by the Men's Committee. On 20th of each month the Editor emails these regular contributors asking for their input by 26th of the month: Chris Wright (for Club and course notes), all Captains (for their notes), Dave Lea (for Men's competition notes), Kim Burnage and Russell Phillips (for Junior notes) and both Professionals (who take it in turn to give Tip of the Month and provide lesson notices).

Once these notes have been received and a final draft of *The Vale* created, it is sent to Chris Wright and the immediate past Men's Captain for publishing clearance. By late afternoon on the last day of each month the approved issue is emailed to Chris Wright and Kim Burnage, with copies to each Section Captain. Chris ensures that some copies are printed for the Clubhouse and Kim uploads *The Vale* to the Club website.

Readers will have realised that they no longer receive an email telling them that the newsletter has been placed on the website. This was a Club management decision, based on the reasonable assumption that, after three years, Members should remember that it is published at the start of each month and know where to find it.

Should a Club Member from any Section wish to receive their own copy of each month's issue by email, the Editor will be more than happy to provide it (he already does it for most Seniors). Just email him your request at lanceredler@yahoo.co.uk and have one 'hot off the press' emailed each month!
