News and Updates from the Club Management

Course

The greens have recovered well from the hollow coring and are putting smoothly again. The dates for hollow coring next year are 30 April/1 May 2018 and 3/4 September 2018. The reason for publishing these dates now is so that our Vice-Captains can avoid booking any competitions or inter-Club matches for the periods 30 April-2 May and 3-5 September.

The 16th pond has now been cleared of reeds. The last pond still to be cleared is the 12th, which has just been started. The ditch between the 13th and 16th ponds will be cleared during the winter, once we get some frozen ground.

<u>Catering</u>. Sunday 29 October is the date for Sunday Roasts and details will be posted on the notice board. The Club Christmas Dinner and Dance is on Saturday 9 December.

<u>Shop</u>. We now have an array of golfing tops for cooler weather, all at 10% discount when purchased with your Club white cards. All spikes remain at half price and you can use your white card as well.

Clubhouse

The plan is to have the bar as a spike bar in British Summer Time but revert to shoes for winter hours. This would mean shoes will be required from Sunday 29 October until Sunday 25 March. However, very wet weather could sink this plan! We have signs made up that say whether the bar is a spike bar or not. In the event of a very wet period before 29 October it would be wise to bring your shoes along as a precaution. We will publish the need for shoes at the 8:00am time slot on the BRS tee booking sheet for the relevant day.

Meanwhile, you can assist us by using the air blower or the brush to clean your shoes.

Rules of Golf

Club Winter Rules

Winter Rules are now in force at AVGC and will remain so until 1 April 2018; the following Rules apply:

<u>Preferred Lie</u>. A ball lying on a closely-mown area through the green may, without penalty, be moved or may be lifted, cleaned and placed within six inches of where it originally lay, but not nearer the hole and not in a hazard or on a putting green. A player may move or place his ball once and, after the ball has been so moved, it is in play.

<u>Ball Plugged in the Rough</u>. A ball which is embedded in its own pitch-mark in the rough may be lifted without penalty, cleaned and dropped within one club length of where it lay but not nearer the hole. The ball when dropped must first strike a part of the course through the green. A ball which becomes embedded in its own pitch-mark after being dropped, may be dropped a second time. After the second drop, should the ball be embedded in its own pitch-mark once again, then the ball may be placed within six inches of the original mark, no nearer the hole. *NB. Note 1 to Rule 25-2 states that a ball is 'embedded' when it is in its own pitch-mark and part of the ball is below the level of the ground. A ball does not necessarily have to touch the soil to be embedded (e.g. grass, loose impediments and the like may intervene between the ball and the soil).*

<u>Tree Stumps</u>. Tree stumps are classed as Immovable Obstructions and relief may be taken in accordance with Rule 24-2b.

<u>Staked Trees</u>. Staked trees covers both trees with a stake and trees secured with metal tree ties that are then staked in the ground. Relief may be taken in accordance with Rule 24-2b.

<u>Woodchip Circles Around Trees</u>. The woodchip circles around the base of trees are classed as Immovable Obstructions. The player must lift the ball and drop it, without penalty, within one club length of the nearest point of relief, not nearer the hole. Relief is taken in accordance with Rule 24-2b.

<u>Ditch on the 10^{th} Hole</u>. The ditch between the 10^{th} and 18^{th} holes is OOB when playing the 18^{th} hole. The ditch is classed as a lateral water hazard when playing the 10^{th} hole.

Insert repair tool just outside the back of the ball mark. Pull the turf toward the centre of the hole. Repeat this same motion on all sides of the hole.

- 2. Gently tap the repaired area with your putter.
- This action stretches undamaged turf over the ball mark providing instant recovery.

- DO NOT pry up the centre of the depression with the repair tool as it exposes the soil and will delay the healing process.
- DO NOT insert repair tool and twist it. This only breaks more turf loose.
- A ball mark takes only 15-30 seconds to fix correctly, a ball mark fixed incorrectly takes over 3 weeks to heal. Please do it the right way.

Pitchmarks are again becoming a problem on the greens, so please do repair them, as shown.

Tip of the Month from your Club Professional, Terry Bunyan

This month is more of something for you to think about. Here are the main fundamentals that I coach you must have in your golf swing, that all the best players do:

- 1. You must get the club down.
- 2. You must stay behind the ball.
- 3. You must clear your left side/turn your left hip out of the way (opposite for left handers).

Also consider this...there is no major weight shift to your left, then to your right...IT IS A TURN!


