Comment

The Vale welcomes its readers back from the Christmas and New Year celebrations, hopefully with the break not marred too much by sickness, although with many course closures...hasn't it been wet! Despite that, we did have a new family arrive on the 9th for a short while during one of the few sunny and 'trolleys permitted' days in January. Those members who have not played for a while will notice when they do just how busy the greenkeepers have been; we thank Luke and all his team.



News and Updates from the Club Management

The annual maintenance of trees has been our main focus over the last two months. There are four main parts to this:

<u>Tree Pruning</u>. This is the task of removing all the low branches. This assists the golfer to find the ball in the rough, to have a backswing that is not caught up in branches and to have a chance of punching a low shot back onto the fairway without hitting a branch. It also has the benefit of encouraging top end growth in the trees, which assists them on their way to maturity. This task has now been completed around the whole course.

<u>Hedge/Bush Pruning</u>. Some years ago we found that hedge and bush growth at the rear of the 6^{th} green prevented sunshine and wind from getting to the putting surface. As a result, the green

remained damper than others and a grass disease was most likely to take hold here first. We removed the hedge to the benefit of the green. The same thing was starting to happen to the 4th green, hence the greenkeepers have opened up the surrounds to this green and the airflow/sunshine is improved.

<u>Copse Maintenance</u>. Each year we pick an area of trees to thin out. This year the greens staff are working on the trees between the 11th, 7th and 8th holes. They have started between the 11th green and 7th tee and are working their way through the copse. The trees near the 8th hole are particularly dense. Removing selected trees will enable them to spread properly without the canopies overlapping. It always sounds sad to be cutting a tree down, but the end result always looks good and will benefit the remaining trees.

Stump Grinding. We are hiring a stump grinder for two weeks in February to remove the old stumps.

<u>Annual Project - New Spreader</u>. We are shortly to purchase a new spreader complete with its own vehicle. This will cover a much larger area than our old spreader and also give us a more even spread of material. Across the whole year this will have different applications:

<u>Greens Dressing</u>. Although the spreader will have a much larger throw, the spreader and its vehicle combined are lighter than the current tractor and spreader that we use. Hence it can be used at times when the tractor could not, to give greater flexibility. It will also speed up the process of top dressing the greens as fewer runs are required.

<u>Greens Surrounds</u>. We will feed and dress the surrounds more often with this machine, so the whole green area will look visually better and the ball will sit up more on the grass.

<u>High Wear Walk Areas</u>. There are some high wear walk areas that can be cut up in poor weather – for example, just across the bridge by the 2^{nd} pond and to the right of the 3^{rd} and 6^{th} greens. With the new spreader we can use a coarse-grained sand to change the soil structure in these key areas. However, we can't start this process until April when the grass is actively growing.

<u>Tee-Dressing</u>. Our existing spreader could not be used on the tees whereas the new one can. Hence our tees have been hand dressed to date, which is not ideal as coverage is not as even as machine applied dressings.

<u>New Tee Signage</u>. All 18 tee signage boards and the welcome board are being replaced with new signage. This will smarten up the appearance of the tees.

Pathways. The pathways will all be topped up with granite dust this Spring.

<u>Primroses</u>. Our thanks go to Sheila Perkins who has planted primroses either side of the 12th pond. These may not flower this year, as they could take the first year for roots to become established, but in subsequent years they should flower and spread. On calm days we might even see their reflection on the pond.

<u>Car Park</u>. Once the water table has gone down the greens staff will fill any holes in the car park and entrance drive.

<u>First Aiders</u>. We now have 13 staff members who have been first aid trained in January. This includes all the greenkeepers, so if a problem arises on the course you could call on any greenkeeper to assist in the first instance.

<u>Catering – Sunday Roasts</u>. The list for Heinz's roast on Sunday 4 February is now full, so we have added a second Sunday roast date of 25 February. These are 2-course roasts, served from 1:00pm, at £10.95 per head. Please see the menu and booking sheet in the downstairs bar.

Hopefully, without tempting fate, if periods of February end up being as wet as January and we need to close the course, then we will offer members a free group golf lesson, cheaper range tokens and a meal deal at lunch time to let people to come up to the Golf Club and have a chat.

Rules of Golf

<u>Standing Astride or on Line of Putt (Rule 16-1e)</u>. A player must not make a stroke on the putting green from a stance astride, or with either foot touching, the line of putt or an extension of that line behind the ball. **Exception:** There is no penalty if the stance is inadvertently taken on or astride the line of putt (or is taken to avoid standing on another player's line of putt or prospective line of putt).

Touching Line of Putt (Rule 16-1a). The line of putt must not be touched except:

- the player may remove loose impediments, provided he does not press anything down;
- the player may place a club in front of the ball when addressing it, provided he does not press anything down;
- in measuring (Rule 18-6);
- in lifting or replacing the ball (Rule 16-1b);
- in pressing down a ball-marker;
- in repairing old hole plugs or ball marks on the putting green (Rule 16-1c); and
- in removing movable obstructions (Rule 24-1).

AVGC Winter Rules

The Club's Winter Rules – decided each year by Chris Wright – are of course posted on the Club noticeboard in the changing room lobby at the start of each winter and published in *The Vale*. These are updated from time to time, according to weather and course conditions. For example a recent temporary Winter Rule – posted on the noticeboard – was that the flagstick should either be left in or taken out – not tended. This Rule lasted from 30 December until the end of January and may have been extended since *The Vale* went to press.

From time to time, again according to local conditions, rules for the day (such as 'All bunkers are GUR') are written on the chalkboard outside the shop entrance.

Please look at these boards before you play – it's not wise to assume that you are up to date.

Tip of the Month from your Head PGA Professional, Russell Phillips

I see a lot of players hitting **at** the ball rather than hitting **through** the ball. It's a subtle difference but this will help with your transition through the swing and take less heavy shots when you take your divot.

To help you visualise this, imagine a second ball sitting up on a tee about four inches in front of every real ball you hit. As you address and swing at the real ball, imagine that your swing must hit the real ball, and then still have enough speed and energy to hit the second ball just as hard and as far as the first. This will help you hit through the first ball, and your shots will be more solid and successful as you end your swing with a 'World Class Finish', hands held high with your chest and hips to target.
