News and Updates from the Club Management

<u>Course</u>. The main focus for the month of October is to regain any grass lost to the drought:

Greens: We hired a Graden machine in early September to re-introduce grass seed and this is now starting to come through.

Tees: These have just been verti-drained, spiked, spiked again, seeded and sanded, then double spiked again. This was in the last week and a half of September, so results have yet to be seen.

Fairways: These will be verti-drained but not for around three weeks, as the ground is still very dry below the first couple of inches.

Greens surrounds: These probably suffered the most through the water restrictions. The Graden machine in early September did carry on one mower width into the surrounds and there is currently partial recovery taking place from the new seed that was introduced to these areas.

However, if there are still some bare patches in early November then we will consider re-turfing selected areas.

<u>Buggies</u>. The use of buggies depends upon ground conditions. However, the long term forecast looks particularly dry so it looks as if we will be running buggies longer than usual.

<u>Sunday Roasts</u>. This is advance notice that the first two Sunday Roast dates will be Sunday 4 November and Sunday 18 November. There will be sign-up sheets in the bar.

<u>Christmas Party Lunches</u>. This may seem early, but if you want to book your work colleagues, your sports or social groups in for Heinz's special Christmas lunches then come and have a chat and secure your preferred date.

<u>Ladies Scratch Team Champions!</u> I am sure the ladies will write in more detail but what a result !!!!!

<u>Wavendon Golf Club</u>. New Rules of Golf – Effective From 1 January 2019

<u>Leaving the Flagstick in Hole (Rule 13.2)</u>. Under this new Rule a player has the choice whether to leave the flagstick in the hole or have it removed/attended - **but** this must be decided before playing the stroke.

The new Rule 13.2a states: if you make a stroke with the flagstick left in the hole and the ball in motion then hits the flagstick, there is no penalty and the ball must be played as it lies. The decision to have the flagstick in the hole **must be made before your stroke**, by either leaving the flagstick in the hole or having a removed flagstick put back. In either case, you must not try to gain an advantage by deliberately moving the flagstick to a position other than centred in the hole. If you do so and the ball in motion then hits the flagstick, you get a general penalty.

NB: the new 'General Penalty' is loss of hole in match play and a two-stroke penalty in stroke play.

Pitch Marks

There is a correct way to repair a pitch mark, as shown:

Tip of the Month from your Head PGA Professional, Russell Phillips

One of the fundamental parts of golf is how you hold the club. A poor grip can lead to a loss of distance and poor direction, so let's get it right! In the long game the grip should always be held in your fingers, not in your palm and should always be gripped lightly. You should imagine you're holding an open tub of toothpaste and don't want to squeeze any toothpaste out. This will allow the club to hinge and move around you correctly.

For a right-handed golfer: Place the club in your left hand, holding it so that you can see two knuckles in your direct line of sight as you look down, this may feel slightly like the club wants to close off, but don't worry this will stop that nasty slice. Place your right hand on top, covering your left thumb, forming a V shape between your index finger and thumb. Let the fingers lightly take hold without trying to reach under to secure it. If you want me to check you've got it right then book a quick lesson on 07843 692948.


This long-standing notice is on the bridge that you walk across to the 13th green, but is often ignored.


Please look left to check the 16th tee before crossing over – this is for *your* safety!
