News and Updates from the Club Management

The Course

The greens staff have completed several projects this month and the weather has lent a helping hand.

The greens and tees have all been verti-drained again in February and the greens and collars have just received their first application of fertiliser. The greens and collars have had three cuts this month whilst the tees have been double cut.

The fairways have all been cut and the only four fairways still left to verti-drain are 7, 9, 15 and 18. The 4^{th} and 6^{th} fairways have received an application of iron to assist in getting rid of some patches of moss.

Most of the deciduous trees have now been pruned with lower limbs and suckers being removed. The only remaining holes to prune are 3, 4, 5, 6 and 7. The conifer project on the course is now complete, with the exception of the 6^{th} hole, which will be finished this month.

The refurbished bunkers have all received new turf and the 4th, 12th and 18th (left hand side) bunkers have been re-opened. The re-turfing on the 15th and 18th (right hand side) bunkers is now complete but there will still be a couple of weeks before re-opening while the turf takes root. There is fresh turf laid from the 8th bridge to the 8th Medal tee to enhance a damaged area.

<u>Buggies</u>. We have had our first delivery of four buggies. Unfortunately, due to the previous theft, we can no longer hire electric buggies. The buggies are available to book but we would ask all buggy drivers to give the greens an extra wide berth at this time of year. Ground conditions are currently excellent but we do recognise it is early for the buggies and the weather might yet have a sting in the tail. We would therefore ask those booking a buggy to leave a phone number in case the weather deteriorates and we need to withdraw them from the course.

New Members

Every year we lose some members in the Winter and need to set about replacing them in the Spring. This is where we reach out to existing members and request that you chat to your friends and see if they would be interested in joining the Club. As an incentive, from 1 March 2019 to 30 April 2019, for each member that you introduce we will put a £20 top up onto your white card.

To assist you in this task the 2019 fees are £895 for a 7-Day member and £640 for a 5-Day member. This is for a rolling year and is well under the going rate for a Members' Club. The course is in great shape for the time of year so ask your friends to keep their green fee ticket if they come up to play the course with you and then, if they join, they can get that green fee refunded off their subscription.

Sunday Roasts. Heinz will be cooking his roasts next on Sunday 10 March. The sign-up sheets are in the bar.

Rules of Golf

<u>Putting Greens – Rule 13</u>. A key change to the Rule applying to putting greens (previously Rule 16) relates to the type of damage that may be repaired before putting. Rule 13.1c refers to improvements allowed on the putting green, identifying what damage may be repaired without penalty. 'Damage' is defined as damage caused by a person or outside influence, such as:

- ball marks, shoe damage (such as spike marks) and scrapes or indentations caused by equipment or a flagstick;

- old hole plugs, turf plugs, seams of cut turf and scrapes or indentations from maintenance tools or vehicles;

- animal tracks or hoof indentations, and
- embedded objects (such as a stone, acorn or tee).

<u>Searching for a Ball – Rule 18.2</u>. The time limit for searching for a ball has been reduced from five minutes to three minutes, BUT the time starts only once the player or the player's caddie has started to search for it. Additionally, a 'reasonable time' is permitted to identify the ball as that of the player, especially if the player is not where the ball has been found.



Tip of the Month from your Head PGA Professional, Russell Phillips

Worn old grips can often lead to a poor hold of the club, which is too firm adding un-necessary tension in the wrists. This tends to a poor release of the club and a loss of power. If you have not had your clubs regripped in the last two years, this might be an easy solution to stop that slice and gain distance. If the grip is new you can hold the club lightly, relieving tightness in the wrists and allowing the club to naturally square up. This will help you get rid of the nasty slice and improve the distance the ball goes. A full set of 13 clubs can be fitted with new grips from as little as £39, so why wait!
