#### **Comment**

May has been another good month for holes-in-one – we seem to have had 12 aces during the past 12 months!

A very helpful article regarding handicaps is in this issue by our Club Handicap Secretary; it should help members to understand how the handicapping system works.

#### News and Updates from the Club Management

## The Course

We have recently had restrictions placed upon us by the Environment Agency, which mean that we will not be able to withdraw water from the stream unless the region receives significant rainfall. In essence, we are busy putting together a three-pronged attack to the problem:

<u>Short Term</u>. In the short term we need water on the course as quickly as possible. The greens and tees are already showing signs of drying out and we need to reverse this ASAP. We should have had six 10,000 litre tanks dropped off near the 2<sup>nd</sup> pond by the time you read this. The short term solution is the most expensive one as we are literally buying in drinking water to use to irrigate the greens through the normal sprinkler system.

<u>Medium Term</u>. In the medium term we are looking at much larger storage tanks that would be able to take non-drinkable water. Unfortunately there is a lead-time on getting these but we will be buying one as the water will be cheaper. An irrigation expert will be discussing options on 30 May.

Long Term. The best long term option is to build a holding pond. This will require planning permission but we are hoping this could be fast tracked with the recommendation of the Environment Agency. The idea behind these is that they are filled between November and March if there is sufficient rainfall in that winter. Then, if any restrictions are applied in the summer, we are able to revert to the holding pond for water.

We can't yet say exactly where everything will go as we are in the midst of meeting with the irrigation personnel. However, it is likely that we will be craving your patience at some point. For example, one likely scenario is that tanker lorries will be driven down to the 2<sup>nd</sup> pond area when it is time to fill the tanks. They could take up to two hours to fill the tanks so players will just have to tee off regardless of engine tick over. A second possibility is that the larger storage tank could be nearer the Clubhouse. It is then possible that a hose could run over ground to the 2<sup>nd</sup> pond in which case it would be classed as 'greenkeepers workings' and relief given. Equally, it could be that a pipe is laid underground with a mole drainer in which case the line of this pipe would be GUR for some time. We should be able to give a more precise update in the July issue of *The Vale* newsletter.

## Theft from Work Vans

These thefts are still prevalent in the local area, hence this item is repeated this month. Thieves are looking for tools from work vans. Work vans at Golf Clubs are particularly being targeted as the thieves think the vans will be parked up for hours. Police advice is not to bring your work van to the Club. Further advice is for the van to be empty if you have to bring it.

There is no roll up on Saturday 8 June as there is insufficient time on the tees with both a Ladies Cup and Men's Club match to follow.

#### **Rules of Golf**

#### Spot of Ball to be Lifted and Replaced Must be Marked (Rule 14.1a)

Before lifting your ball under a Rule requiring it to be replaced on its original spot, you must mark the spot, which means to:

- place a ball marker right behind or right next to your ball, or
- hold a club on the ground right behind or right next to your ball.

If you lift a ball without marking its spot, mark its spot in a wrong way or make a stroke with a ball-marker left in place, you get **one penalty stroke.** 

## What to do if Replaced Ball Does Not Stay on Original Spot (Rule 14.2e)

If you try to replace your ball but it does not stay on its original spot you must try a second time.

If your ball again does not stay on that spot, you must replace the ball by placing it on the nearest spot where it will stay at rest, **but** with these limits depending on where the original spot is located:

- the spot must not be nearer the hole.
- original spot in general area the nearest spot must be in the general area.
- original spot in bunker or penalty area the nearest spot must either be in the same bunker or in the same penalty area.
- original spot on putting green the nearest spot must be either on the putting green or in the general area.





#### Tip of the Month from your Club Professional, Terry Bunyan

To help your putting, especially those who miss short putts, spend just a moment to actually look to see if your putt - no matter how small - has any break in it. So often I hear 'We don't read the putt as we don't want to hold up the group behind'. It takes just a few seconds and can be done while you're waiting your turn.

## Handicap Update by Neil Meldrum

I'd like to take this opportunity to introduce myself and address some issues that members (both old and new) appear to be having. My name is Neil Meldrum and I have the (dubious) honour of being the handicap secretary for 2019/20. If you have any handicap queries please feel free to drop me a line meldrumnelly@aol.com.

<u>Competition Handicaps</u>. When you log into the system either in the bar or on HowDidiDo on your own device, if there is a lowercase 'c' next to your handicap number then you have a competition handicap. If you do not have a competition handicap you are unable to participate in Club competitions (including singles and doubles knockouts) or competitive Club matches.

Maintaining a Handicap. It is the player's responsibility to ensure they maintain a current handicap, so please check yours. It can be maintained by submitting three cards per annum that are played under competition rules e.g. no 'gimmies'. Please note that if your handicap lapses during the course of a competition (usually winter knockouts that run over into the next calendar year), then you will need to renew it quickly or you will forfeit your place in the competition.

<u>Handicap Assessment</u>. At AVGC we use an electronic system to assess initial handicaps and ongoing reviews. Whilst there is an annual review in December and some people are the lucky recipients of a late Christmas present in January of a reduction or increase in handicap, there is also an ongoing review of performance throughout the year.

<u>Initial Handicap</u>. To gain an initial handicap, members need to submit three cards. Please ensure that your name, membership number, date, time, tee played from, marker's name and membership number are clearly legible. Place completed cards in the box adjacent to the entrance of the changing rooms (you can submit them one at a time, I don't need all three together). Please note that the marker must be an AVGC member with a competition handicap. Any cards failing to meet these criteria will be rejected.

Supplementary Cards. If you wish to submit supplementary cards in order to maintain your handicap, or you have a period where you are unable to make the regular competitions, you need to adhere to the following. Log onto the system in the bar before starting your round (ensure you select the tee you are playing from) and declare that you will be submitting a card. Please ensure that your name, membership number, date, time, tee played from, marker's name and membership number are clearly legible. After the round enter the score on the system and place completed cards in the box adjacent to the entrance of the changing rooms. Please note that the marker must be an AVGC member with a competition handicap. Any cards failing to meet these criteria will be rejected.

Performance Against Handicap. Members (both old and new) can become frustrated by not shooting handicap or better on a regular basis. This can lead to requests for handicap reviews or adjustments. As stated previously, handicap assessment is an ongoing process and members can help this by playing in competitions or submitting supplementary cards. It is worth noting that national statistics from HowDidiDo show that on average people play to the buffer zone around 18% of the time and score better than handicap around 8% of the time. That means if you play three competition rounds or friendlies under competition rules (no 'gimmes') a month, then you are likely to shoot better than handicap around three times a year. Please note that the Standard Scratch Score off the yellows is 71, not 72.

#### Holes-in-One

The holes-in-one continue to build up, with three at AVGC during May. This time the congratulations go to Barry Crocker for aceing the 17<sup>th</sup> on 7 May, Chris Thorogood the 8<sup>th</sup> on 14 May and Austin Brandt the 8<sup>th</sup> on 18 May.


