He has added water retentive tablets within a cage inside the new tank which means that as the water hits the green there is already a water retentive agent going onto the green. The greens have therefore stayed greener whilst we have managed to use less water.

We welcomed Tye to the greenkeeping team last month and give a warm welcome to Nathan this month. Nathan's early working years were in greenkeeping, and then he worked for Frost's Garden Centre before looking forward to returning to greenkeeping with us. We wish them both all the best.

Courtesies. By the time that you read this we will have hosted the County Foursomes on Sunday 28 July. We would just like to add a word of thanks to Millbrook, The Bedfordshire, Leighton Buzzard, Aspley Guise and Pavenham Park Golf Clubs who offered our members a courtesy round on that day whilst our course was closed for the championship.

Course Record. The course record is for a round played in competition conditions. The record of 67 has been recorded by Dave Randall, Bradley Finch and Kai in the past, but these were replaced by a great round of 66 shots by Will Shackleton in the July Medal. The only sad thing from Will's point of view was that when he added his handicap of +2 to make a nett 68 he didn't even win the Medal, but was beaten on countback by Russell Crane! However, that target card of 66 could last for many years – well done Will.

Rules of Golf

For a change, here is a short quiz, that may well need you to refer to the Player's Edition of the Rules of Golf:

- 6: A player's ball is found by another player 2 minutes and 50 seconds after she began searching for the ball. It takes the player 30 seconds to get to her ball and identify it as hers. As the ball was identified after the three minute search time had finished, the ball is considered lost. A – True. B - False

- 1: Correct answer A. See the definition of Temporary Water.
- 2: Correct answer A. See the definitions of Outside Influence and Natural Forces.
- 3: Correct answer A. See Rule 21.1a and the definition of Stableford.
- 4: Correct answer B. See the definition of Obstruction.
- 5: Correct answer A. A player must have knowledge or virtual certainty (95% likely) that his or her ball is in a penalty area in order to take back-on-the-line or lateral relief under Rule 17.1d. See Rule 17.1 and the definition of Knowledge or Virtual Certainty.
- 6: Correct answer B. If a ball is found within three minutes of the player or her caddie starting to search for it, the player is allowed a reasonable time to identify the ball, even if that happens after the three-minute search has ended.

The end of June saw the third playing of the Men's and Ladies Pairs Championship, which is growing in popularity and this year a total of 40 pairs took part. After two days of competition it was the pairing of Mark Adams and Paul Herridge who took the title, with Will Platten and Shaun Houghton runners up.

July began with the midweek Medal and an excellent round of nett 66 saw Clayton Barlow take the honours. Norman Ellison took second place on countback from Will Shackleton, both players recording nett 69s.

The July monthly Medal saw the 19-year-old course record finally broken when Will Shackleton posted a superb round of 66. However it wasn't enough to win Division 1 as Russell Crane won that, his nett 68 beating Will Shackleton on countback. Third place went to Darren Horne also with a nett 68. Countback also decided Division 2 with Binzy Bowden edging out Russell Dunn, both scoring nett 70s. Third place went to Alan Connell (nett 71). Division 3 saw a clear winner with Dean Ridley recording a nett 67, two shots clear of second placed Daniel Lotter. Liam Udall (nett 70) was third.

The Midweek Club Championship gross title went to Will Shackleton, whose 75 was a shot clear of last year's winner Lee Sarmple, with Alex Robins a further shot back in third. There was a surprise winner of the nett title when Stasiu Unsing recorded an excellent round of nett 66, four strokes clear of second placed Ian Pullin and third placed Andy Frankum.

Ian Pullin continued his good form in the Midweek Stableford when he won with a fine 42 points. Carl Epaminondas and Paul Morgan took the minor placings, both scoring 41 points.

Kris Manley won his second title of the summer with a fine victory in the Professional's Cup, finishing six up on the course in the 'bogey' format event. Martin Higgins (5 up) was second with Adrian Fallon (4 up) third.
