News and Updates from the Club Management

The Course

The course is in good condition partly due to the efforts of the lads and partly due to the plentiful rainfall this month. We will say a sad farewell in a few weeks' time to Matt, who has been an excellent greenkeeper, and wish him all the best in his new career. We give a warm welcome to Tye who joined the team last week. We are also looking to add one further greenkeeper to the team to counter the tremendous growth on the course after a wet June!

We are still proceeding with additional irrigation measures in case of future restrictions in water use. We are currently able to water again – indeed the River Ouse had a flood warning for residents in June!! However, we are trying to put contingencies in place for the future. We have laid a circular concrete base by the second pond and have a 100,000 litre steel storage tank that will be built upon this base. We are also burying new pipework that goes from the greenkeepers' compound down to this tank.

We have recently hosted an RAF Championship at the Club and thank our members for their flexibility. The income generated from this will certainly go towards the cost of the irrigation measures!

Kitchen

The plan of opening the kitchen late on a Thursday worked, especially with the Sundowners, but there was no take up for catering on a Friday. Hence, in July we will keep the kitchen open until 8:30pm on a Thursday but close at the normal 4:30pm on a Friday. Rules of Golf

Ball at Rest Moved (Rule 18)

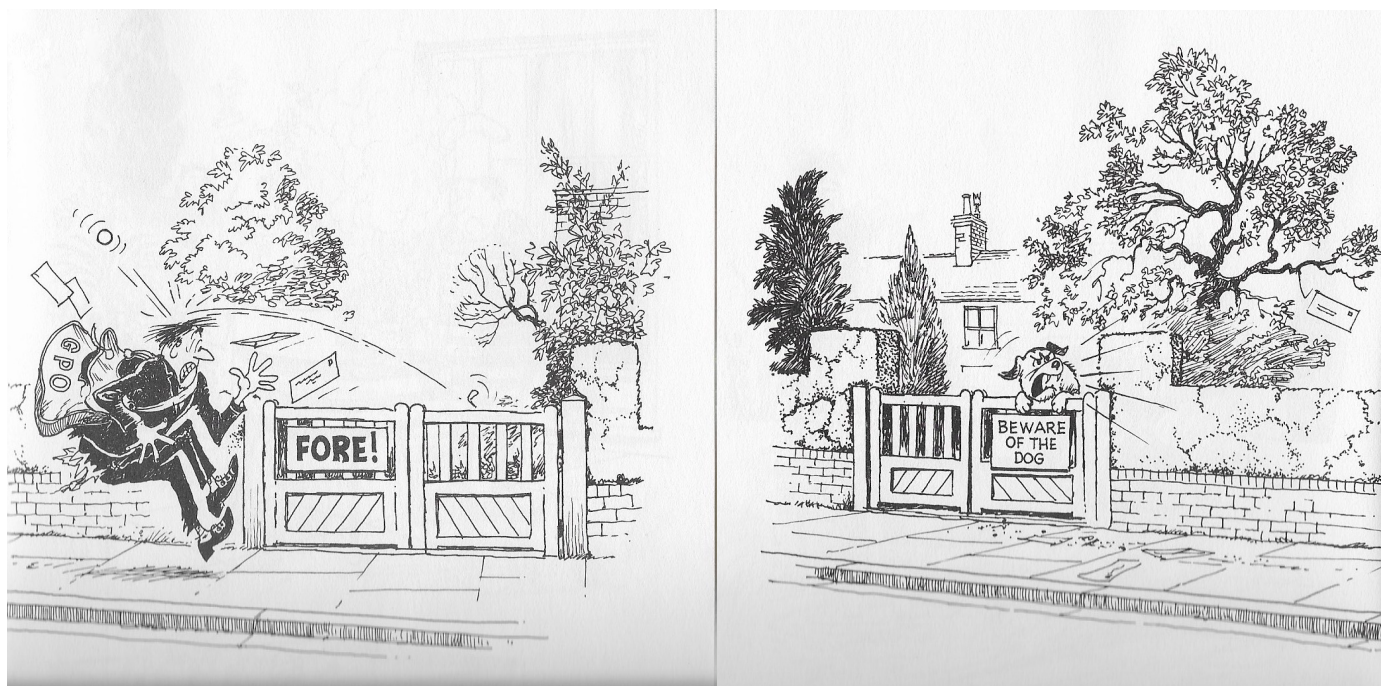
You take a practice swing. You step a little closer to the golf ball and take another. Whoops - you just accidentally hit the golf ball with that practice swing! What were you thinking? What you might be thinking now is: Do I have to count that? Is it a stroke? Is there a penalty?

First, answer the question 'Was the ball in play?'. The answer to what happens when you accidentally hit the golf ball with a practice swing depends on whether the ball was already 'in play' (or not). Remember - a ball is 'in play' from the moment you make a stroke at it on the teeing area until it is in the hole.

If the ball is on the teeing area and you have *not* yet made a stroke at the ball, then the ball is not yet in play. Accidentally hitting the ball with a practice swing in *that* situation does not result in a stroke or a penalty.

If the ball is 'in play', a practice-swing mishap results in a penalty. Once you've made a stroke at the ball on the teeing ground, the ball is considered 'in play' until you hole out. Then the question of whether a practice swing that makes contact is a stroke or penalty (or both) is covered under Rule 18, 'Ball at Rest Moved'. If you accidentally move a ball that is in play with a practice swing, it's a one-stroke penalty. You must replace the ball to its original position and play it correctly.

(Unless... the exception to the preceding statement is when the ball is on the putting green before you take your practice swing. If the golf ball is on the putting green and the golfer accidentally moves the ball, it is not, according to the 2019 Rules of Golf, a penalty so long as the ball is replaced.)

Tip of The Month from the Head PGA Professional, Russell Phillips

Are you struggling with your short range pitch shots around the green? Quite often it is hard to trust a lofted wedge to do its job and pitch the ball high and controlled over a short range. It is important to create a good controlled ball strike. To do this you need to accelerate through the ball and keep the wedge on a downward angle of attack. This seems obvious, but often people flick their wrists and if you let your hands flick the club through, instead of pushing the handle through, the clubhead lifts making an upward angle of attack which causes the wedge to lift and thin the ball. Try to shorten the backswing and **push** the handle through to create the power. Try it out on the chipping area.

Lessons from Russell Phillips

Dear all...as some of you may know I am expecting my first baby any day now and so will not be around much in July. If you need some help with your game here is what I'll be offering in July and August:

Increase your distance! Swing Speed Programme

Get that swing speed up with my new programme using my swing stick and launch monitor. At the start we will monitor your clubhead speed and ball speed. During the session I will be looking to increase both with this easy method. If you don't improve you'll get your money back!

6 x weekly 30-minute sessions £120 for members and £150 for non-members.

Game MOT

Get an MOT once a month to make sure the game stays in check this summer. I am offering 3 x 1 hour lessons for £90 to members and £120 to non-members.

Notes from the Handicap Secretary

Between 26 May and 23 June course statistics are showing that the course is playing fairly tough. The hardest holes have been 13, 14, 6 and 18, with hole 13 averaging 1.83 strokes over par. The easiest holes have been 1, 17, 9 and 2, with hole 1 averaging 0.67 over par. So for all of us (including me) that have not played to handicap or even been in the buffer zone during that period, it's not a surprise given the statistics.

The course has only given up two Eagles and 146 Birdies from the white tees, with 245 competition rounds being played and it is good to see that there have only been around 5% of cards with an NR. Please keep this up as it helps maintain a fair system for all. There are currently 94 players without a competition handicap and I urge everyone to ensure they know their current status and take action where necessary. This will be particularly important as we head towards the Club Championships.

Lastly, there are 11 players up for Continuous Review (CR). Players are subject to CR if they play seven consecutive competition rounds without achieving their buffer zone or better. In other words, they have received a 0.1 handicap increase seven times in a row, which triggers CR. A list will be circulated to the Captains for comment and submitted cards will be reviewed before deciding whether a handicap adjustment is required. No players have triggered an Exceptional Scoring Reduction, but given the course stats I'm not surprised.
