News and Updates from the Club Management

The Course

We were delighted to see so many good gross scores in the Club Champs, which reflected both the course and members playing well! The final 68 from Darren and 74 from Sue were both special rounds considering that additional Club Champs pressure. We also heard there were some excellent men's nett scores, but we lack detail as the shy and retiring winner simply wouldn't discuss his rounds!

The hollow core and top dress of the greens will take place on Monday 2nd, Tuesday 3rd and Wednesday 4th September. The course is still open for play but should be viewed as social, practice golf. The course is not available for singles or doubles knockout matches. The reason for this is that the cup is removed from the green when the hollow core machine passes by so there will probably be a couple of greens that you can't play per round. In that instance you might give yourself 'up and down in 3', for example, and move onto the next tee. Alternatively, these can be good days to make use of your SmartGolfer cards. This period of greens maintenance is essential though for the long term health of greens.

We would like to add our thanks to Dave Lea and all the starters/marshals/ball spotters/helpers that made the Champs such a success.

Clubhouse Matters

We have tried opening the kitchens late on a Thursday and Friday evening to see if there was any demand. The Friday did not have any demand so this trial has now come to an end. The Thursdays, with Sundowners, was successful so the kitchens will remain open on a Thursday evening in September. This won't carry on into October as there is not enough daylight to get nine holes in after work.

The trial of offering bacon/sausage/egg baps early for the Club Champs was successful, so Dan will continue to come in early on Men's Medal days for at least September, October and November. We will then review demand at that point before deciding whether to continue.

We continue with the trial of coffee machine beans. We are trialling five different beans, so when you have a coffee put the date and your comments on the sheet by the coffee machine. If we can identify a clear favourite that will become the 'club bean'.

Rules of Golf

Once again there are some quiz questions to test you.

QUESTIONS

- 1: For relief without penalty to be available, temporary water must be visible before the player takes her stance. A – True. B – False.
- 2: A player hits her shot out of bounds from the fairway. When dropping the ball under stroke and distance, she must drop the ball as near as possible to the spot from where the last stroke was made, no nearer the hole. A – False. B – True.
- 3: In stroke play, a player's ball comes to rest on a gravel surfaced road. He is entitled to relief from the road but decides to play the ball as it lies. He removes some gravel that might interfere with his stroke. What is the ruling? A - The player gets a penalty of one stroke. B - There is no penalty. C - The player gets a penalty of two strokes.
- 4: A and B are partners in a foursome. Player A drives and there is doubt as to whether the ball is out of bounds or not. If the players decide to play a provisional ball, who must play it? A - Player A. B - Player B. C - Either player may play the provisional.
- 5: The nearest point of complete relief is the reference point for taking relief under the unplayable ball rule (Rule 19). A – True. B – False.

6: In match play, a player's ball is in a penalty area in some shallow water, but he decides to play it as it lies. He deliberately touches the water in the penalty area on his backswing. What is the ruling? A - The player gets two penalty strokes. B - There is no penalty. C - The player gets one penalty stroke.

ANSWERS

1: Correct answer B. Explanation: For free relief the temporary water must be visible before or after the player takes her stance. See Definition of Temporary Water.


2: Correct answer A. Explanation: When dropping a ball under stroke and distance in the general area, a ball is dropped within one club-length of the point from which the previous stroke was made, but in the same area of the course as that point.

3: Correct answer B. Explanation: Gravel is a loose impediment and a player may remove loose impediments without penalty anywhere on the course under Rule 15.1. See also Loose Impediment/4.

4: Correct answer B. Explanation: If the side decides to play a provisional ball, it must be played by the partner whose turn it is to play the side's next stroke (Rule 22.3).

5: Correct answer B. Explanation: The Nearest Point of Complete relief is the reference point for taking relief from an abnormal course condition (Rule 16.1), dangerous animal condition (Rule 16.2), wrong green (Rule 13.1f) or no play zone (Rules 16.1f and 17.1e), or in taking relief under certain Local Rules.

6: Correct answer B. Explanation: There are no special Rules limiting how a ball may be played from a penalty area, meaning there is no restriction on a player touching water in a penalty area with his backswing (Rule 17.1b).

Tip of the Month from your Head PGA Professional, Russell Phillips

Struggling with your short game? Here are a couple of drills that can help you adapt and improve your touch around the green:

- **PAR 18.** Select one hole on the edge of the putting green and a club of choice (to keep the greenkeepers happy I recommend 7,8,9 or PW). Locate nine positions around the green giving yourself three easy, three medium and three tough lies. See how many shots it takes you to get the ball holed from each location. Start by chipping, then putting that one out before moving onto the next start position. Level grading is 18 or less (scratch h'cap); 19-21 (< 9 h'cap); 22-24 (10-18 h'cap) and > 24 needs work so practice.

- Through the bag, pick an easy hole location on the putting green and take your 6,7,8,9 and PW. You simply need to chip in a ball with all your clubs with the fewest attempts. The perfect score is five - see how low you can go! I will be working on this next week and can give you a more realistic goal if you need.

August began with the Marstons Trophy and last year's winners Jon and Tom Read made a strong challenge to retain the trophy, only to be beaten on countback by Andy Ashcroft and Adrian Fallon, both teams scoring 46 points.

The August monthly Medal saw Will Shackleton produce another excellent score to win Division 1 with a gross 68 (nett 70), a shot clear of Men's Captain Steve Chandler in second. Shaun Houghton (nett 72) was third. Promotion to Division 2 hasn't affected the form of Dean Ridley, who took the honours with a nett 70. Alan Connell took second place a further shot back on countback from third placed Andrew Laidlow. Best nett score of the day came in Division 3 with Mark Mansfield recording an impressive nett 67. Terry Squires (nett 71) was second with Mick Fenables (nett 73) third.

The August midweek Medal saw Rafe Birch-White claim victory with a countback win over Graham Magill, both players recording nett 71s. Third place went to Steve Willett with a nett 72.
