Comment

Members will no doubt be rather pleased and rather astonished at the amounts raised during the past month in aid of our two very worthwhile charitable causes.

News and Updates from the Club Management

The Course

October is a key month to try and improve the playing surface whilst we experience that early autumn flush of growth. We got a head start on this last year and a lot of the damaged areas recovered well. We have already started this process this year and will continue throughout October.

Greens. The greens have not been at their best following the hollow core/dress as the weather turned unseasonably warm and dry. This meant that we had to raise the height of cut slightly to assist with disease prevention. However, the last week has been wet and already the greens are showing signs of recovery. We should be able to slightly reduce the height of cut once again in the next couple of weeks.

Tees. Tees are being verti-drained and dressed. After this they will be scarified and seeded. The 2_{nd} tee has been dressed early and is showing signs of improvement.

Bare areas. Bare areas will be scarified and seeded to aid recovery. Bare areas around bunkers will be re-turfed.

Fairways. Fairways will be slit and verti-drained this year.

Rough. At the end of the month the long rough will be cut down.

<u>Preferred Lies</u>. We will adopt England Golf's recommended dates for preferred lies, which are 1 October 2019 to 30 April 2020.

Clubhouse Matters

Normal shoes in the Clubhouse. We have experienced a wetter spell of weather recently, so now is a good time to ask members to change out of their golf shoes to enter the bar/restaurant.

Sunday Roasts. The next Sunday Roast will be Sunday 27 October at 1pm. Beware - the clocks will have gone back on that day.

Rules of Golf

Provisional Ball

Rule 27-2a(ii) of the 2016 edition of the Rules of Golf stated that a provisional ball had to be played by a player '...*before he or his partner goes forward to search for the original ball*.' This was subsequently modified, so that if necessary a player could go forward '*approximately 50 yards*' and still be able to return to play a provisional ball.

Rules have now changed. In the 2019 Player's Edition of the Rules of Golf, no such restriction is imposed and, to clarify the situation, Official Interpretation 18.3a/2 states:

Playing Provisional Ball after Search has Started is Allowed

A player may play a provisional ball for a ball that might be lost when the original ball has not been found and identified even if the three-minute search time has not yet ended.

For example, if a player is able to return to the spot of his or her previous stroke and play a provisional ball before the three-minute search time has ended, the player is allowed to do so.

If the player plays the provisional ball and the original ball is then found within the three-minute search time, the player must continue play with the original ball.

To maintain a sensible speed of play, we ask that players should:

- always play a provisional ball before moving forward if in any doubt, and

- ensure that the search does not extend past three minutes regardless of whether they are actively looking themselves or not.

Tip of the Month from your Club Professional, Terry Bunyan

Something to think about...the clubhead must get to the ball before the buttons on your shirt do!

Jack Nicklaus was quoted to say that *'You can't release the club too soon.'*. What does this mean? Well, as I have coached for many years you must be relaxed at address, with light grip pressure to allow the arms to FALL from the top of your swing and allow the hands to release the club. This creates natural motion to increase clubhead speed and a more inside swing path.

The Club Junior Championship was the penultimate Championship event to be held this year, resulting in:




