News and Updates from the Club Management

The Course

The course survived the early rains (September to November) very well as the greenkeepers had slit and verti-drained the course. This gave the rain somewhere to go. Unfortunately, the above average monthly rainfalls have shown no signs of abating and once the water table has risen to meet the surface at certain points, this negates the effect of slitting and verti-draining. At that stage all we can do is try to manage the situation by closing in the very wettest of conditions, since the damage to the course is far greater in the worst of the conditions. Even Woburn has had its closures this winter - and they probably have the best drainage around.

The good news is that there is still plenty of grass on the tees and fairways, so Luke is still optimistic of a return to good playing conditions for spring/summer. The greens are still in good shape and the lads have continued with a winter program of feeding the greens with nitrogen, potassium and magnesium. The greens are less likely to catch 'winter diseases' when they have the right balance of trace elements within the soil. They have required a little more feed than usual this year as the levels of rainfall have a leaching effect.

If the weather remains wet into February then we will continue with the 'reward passport stamp scheme' for members. We continue to offer small light carry bags at trade (£25), and also offer metal spikes at half price to give you the best possible grip in winter (although it might be better to go back to soft spikes in April).

Planned Course Improvements for 2020

Water Storage Tanks. We are planning to add further water storage tanks near the 2nd pond in March. The tank that we put in this year worked well and gave us water through the summer, but we are planning to cope with another severe heat wave like the ones in 1976 and 2018.

Relaying the 8th and 15th Tees. As a consequence of the severe heatwave in 2018, many Clubs on sand/gravel/chalk suffered with loss of grass. We had two very sandy tees on the 8th and 15th that will be rebuilt this spring.

<u>Irrigation to the 2^{nd} , 8^{th} and 15^{th} Tees.</u> The Men's Section have kindly agreed to have a 'Captain's Project' this year. This will enable us to put irrigation pop ups onto the 2^{nd} tee, and the two new tees to be built on the 8^{th} and 15^{th} .

Clubhouse News

We offer our warmest thanks to Brendan Langan who has fitted new LED lights to the restaurant. This is now far brighter and makes a big difference. We will take the opportunity this winter to repaint the ceiling and walls in the restaurant and are grateful to Andy Bond for the scaffolding.

Sunday roasts will re-start for the year on Sunday 23 February – see the Club noticeboard in the bar.

Membership News

We are continuing with the offer to members of five years of golf for the price of four. This can be 5-day, 7-day, single, or husband and wife. This up-front payment saves you one year's fees but also saves you any price increases over five years. This is open to all members – come and speak to Chris, Leo, Jason or Garry. We are offering six of these memberships – four members have already taken it up – which leaves two more available. Members can apply at any stage, as we will take into account credit from your current membership year. Members currently paying subs on direct debits can also apply.

We are still offering two years of membership at a 5% discount for those who prefer the shorter time period.

These two offers are being made to enable us to make the irrigation improvements.

Rules of Golf

Ball Resting Against Flagstick in Hole (Rule 13.2c)

If your ball comes to rest against the flagstick left in the hole, and any part of your ball is in the hole below the surface of the putting green, your ball is treated as holed.


If no part of your ball is in the hole below the surface of the putting green:


- Your ball is not holed and must be played as it lies.
- If the flagstick is removed and your ball moves (whether it falls into the hole or moves away from the hole), there is no penalty and it must be replaced on the lip of the hole.

Tip of the Month from your Head PGA Professional, Russell Phillips

Often a good swing thought can be 'swing the handle and not the head'. What do I mean by that? The only part of the clubs that your hands attach to is the handle. The handle is in turn connected to the clubhead. If you think about where the handle is in relation to your body you can then really control the centre of strike, the angle of attack and release of the club.

Have a try and focus on the handle and see if it helps with that consistency! I am offering 342 on any lessons purchased in February and March to help players improve their golf.

Handicaps – by Neil Meldrum (Men's Handicap Secretary)

So this is the year? Hopefully, the World Handicap System (WHS) is planned to commence in November 2020. England Golf are running workshops on the system and representatives of the Club will be attending an event on 3 February and hopefully they can provide an update in the next issue of *The Vale*.

The annual review has been completed and a number of players have received the gift of a handicap reduction. There were also a small number of unlucky members who received a handicap increase.

What is the annual review and how is it done? This was a question I wondered about until this year. Quite frankly, I just pull names from a hat. In reality, the software we use to track handicaps and competitions etc produces a recommendation report which includes both reductions and increases. In addition to this we look at competition results that are not captured by the system (e.g. summer & winter knockouts [doubles & singles] and doubles competitions).

I then met with the Competitions Secretary, Seniors' Captain and the Men's Captain to discuss the who, how much (reduction or increase) and when. It cheers up my year and I highly recommend the role of Handicap Secretary to anybody who has a sadistic streak.

There are currently 33 men without a competition handicap. It is particularly important for members to keep a watch on this at the turn of the year, as for the last two years a member of a doubles pairing in the winter knockout has become ineligible to play.

Supplementary cards – this is a difficult area at this time of the year and under the current conditions. I can only accept supplementary cards that I believe have been played under the normal rules of golf. This means if you have done any of the following during a round you should not submit the card:

- picked/placed in the rough,
- cleaned/dropped in the rough,
- picked/placed in the bunker due to abnormal ground conditions (water in the bunker),
- taken free relief from a water-filled bunker or partially-filled bunker (unless the bunker has been declared GUR) or
- submitted a card when all bunkers have been declared GUR (at least one bunker must be in play). You only get free relief from abnormal conditions in the bunker when you drop within the bunker, even if that is just shallower water and, as per normal, not nearer the hole.

The course: for 2019 off the white tees, all holes have played over par during the 2528 rounds recorded on the system. The easiest hole was the 9th, followed by the 11th and the 17th. The hardest hole was the 13th, followed by the 14th and then the 6th. Both the 13th and 14th played more than 1½ strokes over par. The course produced 27 Eagles or better during the year. During the year 134 players have managed to reduce their handicap.

As part of the World Handicap System every course is assessed and given a slope rating. Ideally the assessment is done by a physical visit, however due to the backlog the majority of courses are being done via a desktop review. The aim of the slope rating is to enable players to adjust their handicap when visiting other courses. We have been given a slope rating of 128; apparently this is similar to Millbrook and John O'Gaunt.

Hello everyone.

My name is John Flack and I am not a very good golfer. Some people might even say I am completely useless. It is a matter of degree and perception.

However - I believe I may be the only member of AVGC who cares enough about the course to repair pitch marks. How do I come to this conclusion? The increasing number of unrepaired pitch marks I see on the greens. It must be members causing this damage because there is hardly any corporate traffic at this time of year.

Come on folks. Our green keeping staff do a great job in maintaining the course to a very good standard. Is it such a hardship for us members to make a contribution?

How about we all make a commitment to ALWAYS repair TWO pitch marks on every green when we get there - even if we know we did not make those pitch marks.

I believe this simple action would bring great benefits to all users of the course.
