News and Updates from the Club Management

A very warm welcome back to The Vale to all our members! That last lockdown seemed to go on for an eternity. It was also great to see our staff back, with Heinz and Lee the last to return after the kitchens could resume on 12 April.

We extend our thanks to our Captains and committees for adapting so well and encouraging online entries to competitions during the pandemic. Seek out Jason, Kyle, Dan or Leo in the shop if you require any further assistance to enter competitions.

How has the Club fared? We had to make a policy decision regarding lockdown months and that, as you know, was not to charge members subscriptions whilst under lockdown. This presented its own challenges... a quick bit of maths reveals 600 members, paying an average £850, being discounted by 44% over the last 12 months, reduces income to the Club by £220,000. On the plus side we have been delighted to welcome 85 new members, adding £72,000. Rishi Sunak has also chipped in but there has been a hole to fill, which is why we are grateful to our new members and now face the task of managing a busier Club, whilst still resolved not to place the additional financial burden upon the existing membership.

As a result you will see new membership application forms around the Club from 17 May that show the rate for 7-day and 5-day membership increased by £150. This does not apply to existing members - everyone that has already joined the Club by that date will be re-categorised as 'original members' and your fees will remain at the rates currently displayed on the application forms. The website will need amending as we decided to bring the jump point forward to 17 May from 1 July and to further increase the rate. 'Original members' will retain preferential rates into the future for as long as their membership is continuous.

Some members who paid via direct debits in May 2020 'opted in' or 'half opted in' during the first lockdown. These members will note that we are now calling for £0 (opt in) or half their monthly fee (half opt in) on 1 May, as we promised in an email last year.

The next step in easing coronavirus measures is planned for 17 May. On this date we expect to be allowed to re-open the Clubhouse, changing rooms and showers. The key message that is still being transmitted to Golf Clubs from government via England Golf is to maintain your social distancing - we do not have the staff to monitor the social distancing of golfers in the changing rooms so we ask everyone to use their common sense - if everyone keeps socially distanced we will keep the changing rooms open, if not we will be forced to close them again.

The Club handbooks for 2021 are available for collection from the Pro Shop and the fixture list is found at the back. Please note that there are no longer times reserved on Saturdays or Sundays for Men's rollups - members can still enter the rollups but individual tee times are now booked in the normal way, (from 8:00am 10 days in advance), and you can play in the rollup at any time of the day and not just between 8:00. and 9:15.

In terms of managing the tees generally, 2021 may be the year of highest membership numbers but there are no sheltered tee times for any groups so every member has exactly the same opportunities to book tee times as every other member. Further, this is the time of year where Club matches and various leagues normally take up tee space but we are not holding any of these this summer.

We would like to offer a warm welcome to Andy Hobbs, Will Connor and John Smith who have all joined the greenkeeping team. This extra manpower will enable us to give attention to detail when presenting the course, as well as the option for future projects. The first benefit has been releasing Rob to hand water the greens - who would have guessed there would be a chance of frost throughout April whilst not getting a drop of rain? The second advantage has been more frequent maintenance of bunkers. The next immediate project is to top up our pathways with fresh granite dust.

We have two 'front of house' and one 'Pro Shop assistant' positions available for youngsters between the ages of 17 and 24 under the government 'kickstart' scheme. These are six-month contracts so if you know any friends or relatives who might want such work then do put them in contact with Chris.

Thursday 6 May sees the start of 'Sundowners'. This is a fun 9-hole competition, with a meal, with participants booking a tee time between 5:00pm and 6:30pm. The Sundowner season runs up until the end of August. Finally, Annette's Hat is being played on Bank Holiday Monday 31 May - as this event raises funds for Breast Cancer Awareness the Club will not charge 5-day members for entering.

Rules of Golf


<u>Ball Moving on the Putting Green (Rule 9.3)</u>. A strong gust of wind caused a player's ball to move on the putting green before s(he) had marked, lifted and replaced the ball. What should the player do?

If natural forces (such as wind or water) cause the player's ball at rest to move, there is no penalty and the ball must be played from its new spot. There is an exception to this, which states that if the ball on the putting green moves after it had already been lifted and replaced, the ball must be replaced on its original spot. However, as the ball had not been lifted that does not apply here.

A Word from the Handicap Secretary

I was immediately suspicious when Neil asked me to be Handicap Secretary and said 'Don't worry, it is all done by computer now, so it shouldn't be too time consuming.'. Unfortunately, computers don't always work the way they are supposed to!

Anyway we are now beginning to get to grips with this new World Handicap System, and we are all learning together. I intend to keep a log of the difficulties we experience, so that in due course, we can provide feedback to the system organisers in a positive way to help it improve. The Committee will periodically issue update notes should we find things that people need to know, and we will also use this Newsletter to point out things.

This month, I want to cover two points:

- If you want to submit a card, then you should log in to How Did I Do (HDID) before teeing off. You must check that you enter the correct course White, Red, Yellow, 18 or 9 (front or back). Please also make sure to select the correct competition to enter, as there are sometimes different ones on at the same time. Recently, for instance, we had a Seniors' competition and a Men's Midweek Stableford on at the same time. Some people entered the wrong competition, and as a consequence played off the wrong tees, so became ineligible for the competition they inadvertently entered. It is really important to get this right, so if you are having trouble, please ask in the shop or ask your playing partner to help.
- The basis of the WHS is that your handicap is based on the best eight of your last 20 rounds. If you have not submitted scores for 20 rounds, the handicap is worked out slightly differently.

The chart below explains how it is calculated. This means that new or returning players in particular may find their handicap is quite volatile at first.

We didn't get the benefit of playing though the winter to get used to WHS, so it's been a bit of a learning curve for us all. I won't repeat the key points you need to remember here, there are plenty of reference points elsewhere. However, I would like to remind Seniors that it's a good idea to sign into the correct competition and to enter their scores, preferably to the correct competition! There are some

who seem to confuse the competition they have signed in to with the one they want to play. And the scores might not end up in the correct competition either. All I can observe is that it's just as well the Ladies' competitions aren't visible too, otherwise it could be carnage. So please be diligent.

We have played two primary competitions. The Seniors' April Medal on 19 April was won by Martyn Gates on nett 69, ahead of Peter Codrai, second on countback and Bob Phillips third, both with nett 73. The Seniors' Summer Six (1) played on 26 April. Bob Doherty, appreciating his new handicap, won on 38 points, Dave Simons second with 37 points and on countback Neill Brinklow, third with 36 points. Congratulations to you all on very nice scores. Both competitions had fields in excess of 50 players, so thank you for your support.

Finally, the Seniors' Committee has decided to recommence competition entry fees from 1 June. Further details will be circulated to Seniors but there will be cash and non-cash options. One-off Stablefords, operating in place of the 'roll up', will remain free to enter with the option of the 'Pound Pot'.
