News and Updates from the Club Management

The Course

September Greens Maintenance. The lads will be working on the greens from Monday 6 until Wednesday 8 September. On the Monday and Tuesday, members will only be able to play nine holes as the other nine will be closed for that maintenance work. Wednesday normally sees the course fit for 18-hole play once again, providing there have been no machinery breakdowns.

Ponds. We will need to dig out our ponds this year to reduce silt build up and assist drainage. This could be done in September or October.

Clubhouse. The lockers are open and available to use once again. However, with regard to the virus, we would ask members not to spend unnecessary time in the changing rooms. The showers will remain closed.

Membership. We now have a waiting list for 7-day members. New members will have to wait on the list until one of our existing 7-day members does not renew. At that point they will effectively re-use that membership number. The waiting list for 5-day members will begin on 30 September on a similar basis.

Breast Cancer Awareness Day. Friday 10 September is Breast Cancer Awareness Day. Participants are encouraged to wear something pink! Dan will be at hand before you tee off to provide tea/coffee and a bacon bap for £4.50. Following the round there will be a choice of two specials. No pre-booking for catering is required.

Rules of Golf

Ball Falls off Tee Peg. As you take your swing on a tee, a gust of wind blows the ball off the tee peg just before you make contact with it. Does this count as a stroke? The R&A Rules Manager was posed this question and replied:

'Under Rule 6.2b(5), if a tee'd ball falls off or is knocked off the tee by the player before (s)he has made a stroke at it, it may be re-tee'd anywhere in the teeing area without penalty.

But if the player makes a stroke at that ball while it is falling or after it has fallen off, there is no penalty but the stroke counts and the ball is in play. If the ball remained in the teeing area after falling, it may be re-tee'd without penalty before playing again.'

Notes From the Handicap Secretary, Alan Connell

This month, the points I wish to cover are:

General Play Cards/Playing for Handicap. Casual rounds should all be submitted by logging in on HDID either at the screen in the bar, or on your phone before starting; then entering your score and submitting it before leaving the course. A number of people have placed cards in the box in the lobby and this is not the correct course of action. If you have problems with logging in to the screen or app, then please complete a card, get it signed and then scan it/photograph it and email it to alanconnellAVGC@outlook.com. Cards dropped in the box will not be dealt with as promptly.

Completing Cards. I have been surprised how many people do not complete cards correctly. When you submit a card (especially a casual card), please make sure it is clear which score is yours and which tees you played off, preferably scoring through the marker's score, and total your scores. It must be signed by both the player and the marker. Sometimes the legibility is not good, and if the card has been soaked on a wet day, please feel free to re-write it once back in the clubhouse, provided the rewritten version is signed properly.

Holiday Scoring. Part of the idea of the WHS is to make handicaps more reflective of people's typical standards of play, and hence the encouragement to submit scores. I don't have any issues with playing practice rounds or friendly rounds with gimmies and pick ups when you are out of the hole, but if you want to submit scores when playing away from the Vale, you need to follow a few guidelines. Firstly, to submit a score, it must be played under strict rules of golf, and:

Away Clubs (England). Submit your score via the My England Golf app as you might at your home Club. This must be attested (verified) by a playing partner with a WHS index who also has the My England Golf app. If you are playing in any other country, including the rest of GB & NI, you may need to do more. Currently, the interoperability between countries is very poor and the situation is summarized as follows:

Away Clubs (Wales/Ireland). Register your intent to submit a score with the Club you are visiting, then provide them with your scorecard (signed by a playing partner with a WHS index) and membership number. Alternatively, take the scorecard back to your home Club for them to input.

Away Clubs (Anywhere Else). Return your scorecard (signed by a playing partner with a WHS index) to your home Club for them to input. We suggest you also ask the Club you played at to countersign the card.

England Golf are working with the R&A and PGA to ensure complete worldwide functionality and data transfer. Currently America, New Zealand, most of Europe, England, Ireland, and Wales are compatible, but not Scotland. Full integration is anticipated within 12-18 months. In the meantime, if golfers submit scores overseas (which currently includes Scotland), they must return these scores to their home Club as soon as possible after their return. If golfers belong to Clubs overseas, they must ensure that both Home and Away Clubs have an up-to-date scoring history.

Many courses worldwide are listed on the My EG WHS Portal, but in some cases we also need you provide the slope rating, course rating and par of the course being played, together with clarity on which tees you play off. Four of our members played seven rounds in Scotland and, of these, only four were listed on the portal.

If you want to enter your scores please follow the above rules, then scan and email the cards to alanconnellAVGC@outlook.com. On the other hand, if you just want a relaxing game of golf on your holidays...enjoy!

Friday All Members' Mix-Ups - 'Back to Basics' by Mike Boden

I have noted recent disquiet over the Friday All Members' Mix-Ups and also consulted AVGC and the 33 members who played in the Mix-Ups during the last five weeks – receiving only positive comments to my proposed changes. Therefore, with immediate effect, here are the basic operational details:

- AVGC's objective is provide the whole membership with an opportunity for social rounds of mixed golf.
- Not the responsibility of any Section.
- Non-Qualifier. Casual rounds may be played concurrently on any day.
- Booked Names against tee times are to be respected – it's not a roll up. There is no requirement to fill gaps.
- Upon arrival, members are to notify their presence to the Pro-Shop, as normal.
- 'No Shows' are to be notified to the Pro-Shop.
- Up to two days before the event, Pro-Shop may change your tee time.

HDID Booking. In the absence of a volunteer, I am happy to continue managing HDID for the Mix-Ups. HDID can still be used for signing-in, score entry and the leaderboard for non-qualifying competitions.

Competitions. If regular players want a competition, it's up to them to make their own competition, either on the day, or by a regular user offering to run a simple form of monthly competition requiring only hour per month 'on duty' – contact me if you are interested (mbodenavgc@gmail.com)
