A warm welcome to our new Captains for 2022! Neil, Keith, Charlotte and Charlie look forward to a fun year's golf ahead for all members.

The Course

Welcome back to that big yellow thing in the sky! Conditions continue to improve and buggies are back on the course again. The new greens mower has 14 blades rather than 11 so the greens will have a tighter cut. It is also good to see the first cuts from the new fairway and fairway surrounds mowers. Standard winter rules will be in operation until 30 April 22 (e.g. a preferred lie only on closely mown grass).

This is a good time to make our annual plea on behalf of the greenkeepers – please replace divots, repair pitch marks and rake bunkers for the benefit of all that follow.

We will conduct our greens maintenance between 4 and 6 April – the front nine will be closed on Monday 4 April and the back nine on Tuesday 5 April for this work. We move with the times this year in that the Air2G greens maintenance machine has better scientific reviews than simply hollow coring or verti-draining.

Catering

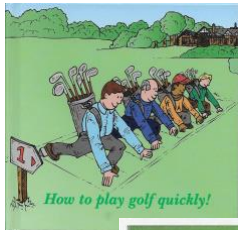

How to Play Golf Quickly (2)

Notes from the Men's Handicap Secretary, Alan Connell

If you have recently joined AVGC and wish to obtain or transfer a handicap the following simple steps should be followed:

- if you have previously held a handicap, then you should have a CDH (Central Database of Handicap) number - which is your unique ID under the World Handicap System. That stays with you for life, so if you have an active handicap, all you need to do is contact the men's or the ladies' handicap secretary, as appropriate, and advise whether you wish AVGC to be classed as your home club, or a secondary club for handicap purposes, and provide the following information:

- a. Full name,
- b. Date of birth,
- c. email address,
- d. date of joining,
- e. membership status (5 day, 7 day, men, ladies etc),
- f. Phone number (home and/or mobile),
- g. CDH number (if you have one), and
- h. clarify what is to be your home club.

- if you do not believe your handicap is likely to be active, or cannot recall, please contact the relevant handicap secretary and provide your name, former club, CDH number (if you have it), email address and date of birth. They can check on the WHS database.

- if your handicap index is not active you will need to proceed as if you were joining a golf club for the first time- but your own CDH number will still be registered.

- if you have not previously held a handicap, you need to submit scores for 54 holes of golf, played in the company of a member with a current handicap who must sign to verify the scores. The cards must clearly identify the scores to be counted, and note the date played. Please cross out any scores from other people playing in the group.

- for men's handicaps, the cards should be scanned and emailed to the men's handicap secretary, or dropped in the box in the lobby to the men's changing room (email will be dealt with much faster).

- for ladies' handicaps, the cards should be scanned and emailed to the ladies' handicap secretary, or sent by WhatsApp and dropped in the box in the ladies changing room.

- if cards are placed in either of the boxes only, please email the relevant handicap secretary and let them know.

- when submitting the cards, please provide the key personal information outlined above.

- the handicap secretary will review the cards and, if approved, advise you of your CDH Number and handicap index.

- once you are registered, you can submit scores via the HowDidiDo or My EG apps.

- if you prefer to submit information in hard copy, blank forms are available in the shop, or can be supplied by the handicap secretary.

Contact details for the relevant Handicap Secretary can be found in the Club handbook or on the website.

Hospice at Home Volunteers, by Jaquie Dixon, Volunteers Co-ordinator

To all the members of Aylesbury Vale Golf Club,

We have been your chosen charity since 2019, when Steve Chandler first announced he would like to support us in his year as Captain. A huge amount of money was raised for us, enabling us to continue comfortably with our work in the community and we were extremely grateful. But that wasn't the end of it, for when Keith became Captain he wanted to continue with us as his charity. This was a very challenging year with Covid now upon us, but incredibly you all raised over £5k for us! To be announced as your charity for a third year, by Neil, was beyond all expectations and we feel very fortunate as a charity, especially in these difficult times.

Your support has enabled us to recruit and train more volunteers, it has allowed us to print leaflets, buy new collection buckets and replace old banners. It has put us in a lovely position where we are researching local holistic complementary treatments that we could begin to offer our clients as a treat in their own home. We strive to improve and build on what we offer, and your support has allowed us to do that. We can't thank you all enough!

Below is a background to explain how and why we were formed, and what our volunteers do.....

Just over 30 years ago it was recognised that people with life limiting illnesses needed support more specific to their needs. It was felt that if people wanted to be cared for at home then this should be possible. Health care professionals would look after their medical needs but there was a gap in their social care.

In 1986, a small group of people in Dunstable had vision and they started the first Hospice at Home Volunteers group, shortly followed by Luton, Leighton Buzzard and West/Mid Beds. An alliance was formed and a code of practice was produced which gives procedures for the role of Volunteer and Trustee. We still all use this code of practice today. The alliance eventually broke up and the groups now work independently, but we still all have a strong bond and work together to maintain the high standards required by the Code of Practice.

Hospice at Home Volunteers Leighton Buzzard is a registered charity run by a team of unpaid Trustees. There are two part time paid staff, a volunteers co-ordinator and also a fundraising co-ordinator.

We provide a free service to anyone registered with a Linslade/Leighton Buzzard or Wing GP.

We are not affiliated to any Hospice and a client does not have to have been in a hospice or have received outpatient care at a hospice in order to use our service. We provide additional support, complementing the medical professionals. We give time, emotional support and some practical help, where appropriate, to those with a **life limiting illness and those who live with them.**

We receive referrals. These can be from the client themselves, from their spouses, friends or family, the community nurses, the palliative care nurse or any of the medical professionals. A volunteer is then matched and introduced to the client. Our volunteers give approx. 2-3 hrs a week to these visits. If the client is well enough, they could take them out shopping or for a walk. Or they could just chat with them, be a listening ear and provide a bit of emotional support. Our volunteer's visit also allows the person's carer, which quite often is the husband or wife, to have a couple of hours respite, where they can go out for a walk, or go shopping.

All volunteers are trained using our Code of Practice, and all our procedures and policies. During training we discuss case studies and try and cover as many scenarios as possible. All volunteers are DBS (Disclosure and Barring Service) checked before they start volunteering.
