News and Updates from the Club Management

The Course

This month's additions to the course include new flags/flag sticks and fresh sand added to the bunkers. Brushes have now been fitted to the fairway and surround mowers to give a better cut and the irrigation is up and running on the greens. The fairway fertilisers have arrived, but we won't spread this until there is some rain in the forecast.

I guess we are never happy with the weather, but it has been 'all or nothing' for some time now. We either get a month of rain or a month of dry – we still await the typical British spring of 'sunshine and showers' for green keepers and gardeners alike!

Safety on the Course

A member has written to us raising concerns about dangerous play and golfers not waiting until it is safe to play. This month seems a good opportunity to expand upon this.

This can be divided between common sense/courtesy and the law.

Taking 'the law' angle first, golf balls are hard and potentially lethal projectiles and golfers have landed themselves in very hot water in legal cases where it has been proved that they deliberately hit a shot when it was not safe to do so. Further, the shout of 'FORE!' no longer absolves legal responsibilities.

Taking the common sense/courtesy angle, it is perhaps time to think about this subject. We haven't had any major rainfall for about a month now so the ball will bound on and travel further. You often hear golfers say 'Sorry, that one came out of the screws' or 'I didn't expect it to go that far'. The point is that golfers need to wait until the group ahead are out of range of their very best shot, and then give them a buffer zone on top so that the ball does not roll up behind them. However, in the event that you have hit a shot that is going near to someone on a different hole, the shout of 'FORE' is still recommended, even if it does not afford legal protection. It gives others a chance to protect themselves.

Finally, there can occasionally be individuals who are simply unreasonable. This can lead to some striking a ball when it is not safe to do so. In this event we have to eliminate such risks to others and can take the ultimate sanction of banning such an individual from the Club.

Sundowners

The Sundowners League starts again on Thursday evenings from 5pm, with the first evening on Thursday 19 May. This is a fun 9-hole event, open to all members and with the option of a meal afterwards. To enter this event go onto Facebook and search for 'AVGC INFO GROUP' and join that group. The Sundowner organiser will then accept you. A post goes up (usually on a Monday) and closes at around 12 noon on the Wednesday and you can message the post for 'golf' or 'golf and food'. We have planned a variety of meals for Thursday evenings already. We have periodic tee times booked for Sundowners between 4:52pm and 6:30pm and golfers gather in the bar when they have got away from work. The organiser on the day then forms groups and sends them out in the next available Sundowners tee slot. There are weekly winners as well as a season winner, with the final Sundowners meeting on Thursday 25 August.

Rules of Golf

Ball Resting Against Flagstick in Hole (Rule 13.2c)

If your ball comes to rest against the flagstick left in the hole, and any part of your ball is in the hole below the surface of the putting green, your ball is treated as holed. If no part of your ball is in the hole below the surface of the putting green:


- Your ball is not holed and must be played as it lies.
- If the flagstick is removed and your ball moves (whether it falls into the hole or moves away from the hole), there is no penalty and it must be replaced on the lip of the hole.


Standard Bearer

If you've putted out, take charge of the flag. It's good form, saves time and takes your mind off the worry of the next drive!




Walk Straight to Your Ball

Never mind about anyone else – take a direct line towards your own ball – it's the quickest route around the course.




Bag Positioning

Leave your bag or trolley on the right side of the green – on the way to your next destination.




Be Prepared

Work out the line of your putt while you are waiting for your turn – it cuts putting time in half!




Give Putts

A Word from the Men's Captain...

Hi all,

The delayed AGM was held on 16 April; the minutes will be published in due course and will be available on the Men's website. The main talking points were around the £5 levy and whether the current system we use is value for money.
