News and Updates from the Club Management

The Course

We have finally seen some rain showers and the course has stood up fairly well to the hot, dry, summer. We were pleased with the way that the greens held up and putted well, thanks to the greenkeepers hand watering and applying water retentive products at times. However, the fairways had to stand alone and as such we still have some areas that need further attention to encourage more growth. Two weeks ago we hired in the machine that cuts a two inch slit in the fairways/approaches and leaves a line of grass seed. These areas are only just starting to germinate but this process should gather momentum with a return to normal rainfall patterns in October.

We have bid a sad farewell to Nathan and Adam this month and thank them for their past endeavours. However, Adam could return so we will keep you posted! In the meantime we have contracted out a couple of tasks, so the hedges and areas of long rough have been maintained by a local farmer. We are looking to sign up Rob, Tom and Freddie to their next level qualifications in horticulture. We will take on new greenkeepers in February to bring the full time team back up to six.

Luke has new blue tee marker tee plaques for the young juniors that have been laid on the fairways of the front nine. The new yardage marker plaques (200, 150 and 100 yards) have now been delivered and will go out in due course. We will also be designing new tee furniture (tee signs with hole detail and map of the hole) to be brought in ready for the start of next season.

Captains' Charity Day is on Saturday 8 October. Dan will be firing up the BBQ after the game and catering details are on the noticeboard, but please sign up for orders by 6 October – payment can be made on the day.

Memberships

We are currently only taking on new 7-day members to replace existing 7-day members who have let their membership lapse. Buggies



Rules of Golf

Relief from Embedded Ball (Rule 16.3).

Relief is only allowed when your ball is embedded in the general area, and then only if it is embedded in its own pitch-mark made as a result of your previous stroke. The diagram below shows how to tell if a ball is embedded.



Winter Rules

Winter Rules will commence at the Club on Saturday 1 October. These are unchanged from those published for the 2021 winter season and can be read on the noticeboard in the changing room lobby.

Handicap Secretary's Report

Please note that General Play rounds are not submitted by placing cards in the box in the lobby. The only way to submit a score is to sign in on HowDidIDo or MyEG (on phone or in the main bar) before starting a round and submitting it electronically. If you are playing stroke play, or Stableford, provided you play with a member with a registered handicap, you can submit the card.

It is perhaps time to remind people how the handicap system works. Your handicap index is the average of your best eight scores out of your last 20. This means that you may submit a good score, and see your

handicap go up, if an even better one is no longer within the last 20. The reverse can also be the case, when you submit an average one, but a poorer one is no longer within the best eight.

Some members have asked how to get their handicap altered, when they feel that injury, illness or simply bad form means that they can no longer play to their handicap. The simple answer is, that they should submit cards and the method of calculating handicaps will mean that the average of the best eight scores goes up and their handicap will correct itself. At the end of a calendar year, we also carry out a handicap review and may make minor adjustments (up or down) to some people. Typically, these are not likely to be more than a one shot adjustment, so the best thing is to submit cards reflecting your current form.

A Word from the Men's Captain...

I'm not sure where the last 12 months have gone. As you read this there will be a little over 12 weeks to Christmas and the pandemic is beginning to feel like a distant memory.

It seems appropriate as we come into Autumn to provide a couple of obvious reminders - the leaf drop has already commenced and finding balls (even on the fairway sometimes) can be challenging. If you have hit the ball in the rough (particularly the longer grass) then you should play a provisional ball, remembering you only have three minutes to find it from when you start looking. If you failed to find your ball and decide to return to the tee, you have essentially declared the ball lost. If your original ball is found after you have made the decision to re-tee, you cannot play it as it is lost, so please ensure you invite any waiting players to play through. If you decide to abandon the hole you can mark it as 'not completed', but you should play out and score the rest of the round as normal, including submission of the scores. Remember there is no real NR anymore. Remember that when deciding that a ball has entered a penalty area you need to be certain or virtually certain that this is the case. In the coming weather I would respectfully suggest that any player can't be virtually certain of this in some cases, such as the ditch on 11 when teeing off or the pond on 13th when teeing off.

I have had a small number of people suggesting that a rule infraction or mistake has been made during a competition or conforming General Play round. However, the vast majority of these have been raised after the competition has closed and, in some cases, days and weeks after the alleged infraction. All suspected rule infractions should be challenged on the course at the time. If an agreement cannot be reached on the appropriate action, every effort should be made to contact a member of the committee

straight away for help with a resolution. It is almost impossible to address infractions that have not previously been challenged on the course.

The All Captains Charity Day is on 8 October and all members are welcome. There is no green fee to pay for 5-day members. Entry is £5 cash including the '2s club' and whilst HowDidIDo booking has closed there are still spaces available. If you contact a committee member we will help sort it out for you. The event is a 4-person team playing a standard Waltz (1 score, then 2, then 3). There will be a prize for the winners (4-ball at DeVere Staverton - December 22) and runners up (4-ball at Aldenham - December 22). If you fancy sponsoring a hole for a bit of fun, the sheet is up in the bar. Darren Horne, six-time (consecutive) Club Champion will be manning the 17^{th} tee. For £1 you can see if you can beat him and go into the prize draw, or for £5 if you beat him you can go in the draw for a 4-ball at Brickendon Grange, valid until March 23. Please bring any spare change you have as we will be rattling buckets and we are hoping to run a raffle, so prize donations for the raffle would be gratefully received.

The Four Nations was held on 24 September. A great day was had by all and for me it almost like the AVGC of old. There was plenty of banter, some great fancy dress and the drinks flowed freely. The Irish had a great start and looked like they were romping it, however most teams rallied to peg them back, with the Scots overcoming them and winning. There were calls for the resignation of the England captain who had managed to steer a team to a resounding loss on consecutive weekends. As last year's winners the Welsh captain had to present the trophy to the new victors, but sadly he had to leave early and this great honour was bestowed on me. There were rumours that the Welsh captain had resigned, but this is yet to be confirmed

A Word from the Seniors' Captain...

With October now here, we are into 'Winter Rules' again. For those who are interested, England Golf have issued their revised guidance notes for playing in winter. Much of it is technical, but the important

thing is to keep an eye on the local rules in place, both for the course generally and the competition you entered.

Whilst on the detailed points of playing, don't forget about your own safety on the course. With autumn leaf fall, finding a wayward ball may prove a little more troublesome. Instead of all the playing group and their equipment disappearing into the trees, think about leaving a trolley or two in the middle of the fairway. That way, a following group will be aware you are there. Even better, call the following group through while you execute your search.

On matters of safety, the playing order protocol of the 13th green and 16th tee cannot be repeated enough. It applies to everyone on the course. Also, with the dry summer, the 13th has brought its own problems with players finding extra yards off their tee shot. Be mindful that, if you are still on the fairway but out of sight of the 13th tee box, the following players there will tee off. Should you be waiting for the 13th green to clear, ensure one of your group remains in sight of the 13th tee box so that the following group is aware that the fairway is occupied.


The Starter's rota has been set up for the winter months. Steve Waters looks after this and if you wish to be involved, please get in touch with him. It does make a difference having someone marshalling competitions and the Committee appreciates the efforts made. As a small gesture of thanks, those on the Starters rota will be entered free into a future competition. Further details will be given nearer the time.

As September included a week of green maintenance, it was a shorter month for Seniors' golf.

I should start with our last competition in August, which was still to be played when copy had to be submitted. This was 3 Clubs and a Putter. Always a round of choices, or lack of them, pending on your club selection. This year's winner was Clive Gear who scored an impressive 43 points and proved that 10 clubs usually carried are surplus to requirements.

On Monday 12th we held the annual Memorial Stableford, in reflection of Seniors Golfers passed, won by Tony Phillips (pictured). We cancelled the last round of the Summer Medals, due to be held on Monday 19th, marking the day of the late Queen's funeral. The last of the Summer Sixes was played on Monday 26th. The winner was Don Huggett, with 40 points.

With the close of the 'summer season' our series competitions ended. The mark of a good summer of golf is the winner of the Order of Merit. It requires consistency in Medal and Stableford formats and is a much-prized honour. This year's winner is Richard
