News and Updates from the Club Management

The Course

The course is now progressing but the rate of improvement is not as great as we were expecting. This is down to a combination of weather and Bank Holidays. The continued rainfall has meant that there have been days when we could not conduct planned machinery work. Bank Holiday-wise, we had two four day working weeks around Easter, with three more to come following the Bank Holidays of 1, 8 and 29 May. We are putting our efforts into groundwork, which will bear fruit as the months pass, but we have additional jobs like digging in the new tee signs and fairway distance markers which we can't get to yet.

As a result of the above we have decided to go for it this year and boost the greenkeeping manpower. Our aim is to become one of the best presented courses in the county by the end of the year – if we do succeed then there should be benefits to offset the larger wage bill.

We welcomed Matt last month and will be welcoming Aiden, Jordan and Jamie before the end of the month. We harbour longer term ambitions of increasing further our teeing grounds and embarking on a few projects, but we will give details of these once we have finished playing 'catch up' and we are ready to actually start work on them.

The raised grass tee at the driving range should be ready to open again within a couple of weeks.

May Bank Holidays

Bank Holiday days are made available for 7-day members to play, but 5-day members can play the course on these days with payment of the reduced green fee in the pro shop. This applies as normal to Monday 1 May and Monday 29 May. However, Monday 8 May is slightly different as an extra Bank Holiday day tacked onto the Coronation weekend. On this day the 5-day green fee will only be charged for rounds booked up until 1pm. Any 5-day members booking a round after 1pm. will be welcome to do so without any further payment.

Men's Medal - Saturday 6 May

We have a chef on from 7.00am on this day to cook a bacon or sausage sarnie for Medal players.

Sundowners

The first 'Sundowners' is on Thursday 18 May. Sundowners is a fun 9-hole format for members each Thursday evening until 24 August, and starts at around 5pm. There is a Facebook group that you can join to register your intention to play, and whether you want the meal on that particular evening after the golf. This fun, social evening is open to all members – for any potential new players, do have a chat with Jason who will explain all!

<u>Walta Huda – Ukraine Talk</u>

Walta Eolodymyr Huda has been a senior member here for many years and is giving a talk at the golf club on Tuesday 23 May at 7.30pm. The talk is "Ukraine: Past and Present". All are welcome – there is free admission (donations to BAMK charity) and the upstairs bar will be open. There are also tee times available to be booked by members (foc) and guests (£20 for 18 holes and £10 for 9 holes) and all monies collected will go to the charity. The tee times are planned to give the right amount of time to play 18 or 9 holes and then be back in time for the talk at 7.30pm.


Rules of Golf

Club Winter Rules.

Winter Rules have now been rescinded, so no more 'pick 'n place' until next winter!

Relief for Ball in Yellow Penalty Area (Rule 17.1d).

The pond in front of the 13th green is a yellow penalty area, so the following diagram shows that if your ball enters it you have the option of playing the shot again (position 1) or taking relief as in position 2, either costing one penalty stroke.



When it is known or virtually certain that a ball is in a yellow penalty area and the player wishes to take relief, the player has **two options**, each for one penalty stroke:

(1) The player may take stroke-and-distance relief by playing the original ball or another ball from a relief area based on where the previous stroke was made (see Rule 14.6 and Diagram 14.6).

Reference Point	Size of Relief Area	Limits on Relief Area
The spot where the player's previous stroke was made (which if not known must be estimated)	One club-length from the reference point	 The relief area: Must not be nearer the hole than the reference point, and Must be in the same area of the course as the reference point

Alternatively, if a player's ball that is played from behind the green overshoots into the penalty area, the same Rule will apply – the ball can be played again for one penalty stroke or the player can cross the water to position 2 and play the ball for the same penalty.

Update from the Men's Handicap Secretary, Alan Connell

There has been an anomaly in the WHS handicapping system since it was introduced, whereby you could only enter scores for rounds played within your home country. England Golf have just announced the following:

England Golf and the GB&I home nations (Scotland, Wales & Ireland) have been working closely with DotGolf to digitise the submission of general play scores via the MyEG app. We are excited to announce this functionality will be going live very soon.

The update will be seamless, and counties/clubs and players do not need to take any further action. Previously, the only way to submit scores were for players to send back their scorecards to their respective home clubs for manual input. With the improved functionality, golfers will be able to use the MyEG app to search for, create score intents and submit scores on any golf course affiliated with England, Scotland, Wales and Ireland.

Furthermore, with this improved functionality, players may have their scores attested by any golfer who is an affiliated member or member of one of the independent golfer programmes within GB&I. This is an exciting time for golfers within GB&I. England Golf are aware of the pressing need for golfers who regularly travel and play golf across the British Isles to have a digital solution to submitting scores and to be able to do it via the MyEG app ensures consistency with the current process for score submission in England. This will again demonstrate the strong working relationships England Golf have with the Scottish, Welsh and Irish nations, enabling us to collaborate to improve the amateur game for all GB&I golfers."

This sounds very positive although no specific date is given just yet.
